Purpose

• To provide inspirational and dynamic teaching across years 7-11 in music and across the Creative Arts faculty

Key duties and responsibilities:

- Demonstrate good subject and curriculum knowledge
- Plan and teach well-structured lessons adhering to the Academy's teaching and learning policy
- Set high expectations which inspire, motivate and challenge pupils
- Contribute to curriculum/pastoral evaluation and development
- Work collaboratively with teaching assistants and support assistants ensuring they are fully briefed on lesson plans and expectations to enable them to fully contribute to improving pupil outcomes
- Be accountable for implementing the Academy's Behaviour for Learning policy and play an active role in the day-to-day management of pupil behaviour
- Contribute to the delivery of extra-curricular music activities, concerts and performances
